**Registration Guidelines**

- o Kids (age 17 & under) must be registered by their parent (NOT a grandparent, a friend, an aunt, or other random person).
- o Registering your child? YOUR account must contain YOUR information, not your child's information. Enter your child's information where the form refers to "the person going to camp" (the participant).
- o Registering yourself? Each adult going to camp (age 18 & up) must create or log into his/her own account and register. A husband doesn't register his wife. A wife doesn't register her husband.

When registering **(2025 registration is closed)**, please check:

- o Was 2025 accidentally entered for the birth year? The age is reflected as a 0 or a -1.
- o Is the gender correct?
- o Is the grade correct?

**Camp meals:**

Meals at Pineywoods are served cafeteria-style in the Dining Hall. As campers proceed through the serving line they can accept or decline any portion of the meal. In general, two or three hot food items are served at every meal as well as other self-serve options.

***Fruit, yogurt, and cereal are available each morning. A full salad bar is offered during every lunch and supper.***

Our kitchen uses nuts, products containing wheat or gluten, eggs, dairy products, and other ingredients that contain allergens. We understand that this can be a medical issue, therefore we will post the menu for each camp on this page no later than two business days prior to the first day of camp for review and consideration by concerned campers/parents.

A camper with a food allergy that medically necessitates a special diet is more than welcome to bring his/her own PREPARED food to camp if, after reviewing the menu, it is determined that he/she cannot eat some or all of the meals provided. Camp Staff will be glad to assist with storage and re-heating of prepared food but cannot prepare special meals for campers during their stay.

Depending on the need and the size of the camp one or two mobile food trailers are also utilized to serve meals:

- The Taqueria serves an alternate hot food option with bottled water.
- The Pizzeria serves Cheese Pizza and Pepperoni Pizza with bottled water and cookies during lunches and suppers.

## Medication Rules & Guidelines

- ALL medication (prescription, non-prescription, vitamins, supplements, etc.) must be checked in with the Camp Medic upon arrival at camp.
- Sponsors are required to turn in their medications the same as students.
- All medication must be stored securely and dispensed from the First Aid Station.
- Medication is not allowed in the dorms.
- Campers are not allowed to share any medication belonging to them with any other camper.
- Maintenance inhalers must be checked in with the Camp Medic.
- Medication needed for immediate use for life-threatening conditions (i.e. rescue inhalers and EpiPens) must be checked in with the Camp Medic unless the camper's doctor requires him/her to keep it on his/her person at all times. The camper must have a written statement of medical necessity from the prescribing doctor for the camper to carry it. The camper is responsible for his/her own medication and may only give it to his/her sponsor to hold (not a fellow student camper).
- At children's camp, a child must be accompanied by a Sponsor when he/she goes to the designated First Aid area.

## Medication Preparation

- Do not bring pill boxes/organizers to camp.
- Prescription medication must be in the original container with the prescription label.
- Non-prescription medication must be in the original container. This includes, but isn't limited to, over-the-counter medications *taken on a regular basis*, vitamins, supplements, etc.
- Each camper must put his/her medication(s) in a Ziploc bag with his/her name and church name on it.
- Each camper must put a signed Medication Form in the Ziploc bag with his/her medications.
- Closer to camp, the medication form will be distributed.

# 2025 PowerPlus Preteen Camps

## WHAT TO BRING

- ◇ Bible, Pen & Journal
- ◇ Hot weather, comfortable, and modest clothing which IS NOT revealing, suggestive, or advertises alcohol, tobacco products, etc.
- ◇ Extra clothes and shoes that can get wet and muddy during Crazy Games (*dark colors only*)
- ◇ Modest swimsuit. Breasts, midriff, buttocks, and genitalia must be covered, or a colored t-shirt must be worn over the swimsuit while at the pool.
- ◇ Sleepwear, Socks, & Underwear
- ◇ Comfortable Shoes, Athletic Shoes, and/or Closed-toed Shoes (*not slip-on*) for the Adventure Park
- ◇ Sunscreen & Sunglasses
- ◇ Towels, Washcloths, & Hygiene Products
- ◇ Pillow & Bedding (*sleeping bag or sheets for twin bed*)
- ◇ Wristwatch
- ◇ Flashlight
- ◇ Hand sanitizer
- ◇ Money for Mission Offering
- ◇ Spending Money for Snack Shack, Gift Shop, etc.

## WHAT NOT TO BRING

- ◆ Cell Phones
- ◆ Pets (*including dragons*)
- ◆ Non-prescription medication
- ◆ Pill organizers
- ◆ Illegal drugs, alcohol, ANY form of tobacco, or vaping device
- ◆ Skateboards
- ◆ Fireworks
- ◆ Knives, guns, or any weapon
- ◆ Clothing which is revealing, suggestive, or advertises alcohol, tobacco products, etc.
- ◆ Immodest swimsuit. Breasts, midriff, buttocks, and genitalia must be covered, or a colored t-shirt must be worn over the swimsuit while at the pool.

- ⇒ Bible Study & Free Time

## POWERPLUS CAMP RULES (revised 10/26/23)

- All persons must check-in/register at the camp office.
- Pineywoods enforces a no-visitor policy during all summer camps to ensure the safety and security of our campers.
- Texas Youth Camp Law requires two adult sponsors in each dorm room. Sponsors must be at least 18 years old (19 for youth camp), have a current criminal/sex offender background check, be approved by their church pastor, and have completed Child Protection Training before coming to camp.
- Dorm utilization must be segregated according to biological sex at birth, with males and females in separate rooms.
- Cell Phone Policy for STUDENTS: Students are not allowed to possess cell phones at camp. "Possess" means carry on their person, keep in their luggage, or otherwise have access to without the supervision of a sponsor.
- Cell Phone Policy for SPONSORS: Sponsors must not allow cell phones to distract others or themselves from the camp program. Phone usage must be limited to only absolutely necessary calls, messages, or internet activity while at camp. Adults may use phones for note-taking, Bible reading & appropriate image capturing while at camp.
- Please respect all camp properties just as you would at the church you attend. We ask you to assist in keeping the grounds clean of trash. Cans are provided camp wide to contain debris.
- Do not throw rocks in the water...at the turtles...at friends...at leaders...or at any living or non-living thing at camp. **DO NOT THROW ROCKS.**
- Pets (including dragons) are not allowed.
- Illegal drugs, alcohol, knives, ANY form of tobacco, vaping devices, guns, skateboards, and fireworks are not permitted. Such items will be confiscated.
- If property or equipment is damaged by any member of your group, your group will be held responsible for any cost incurred for repair or replacement.
- If dorm room is excessively filthy during your stay or upon departure, your church will be assessed a fine of at least \$50.
- The lake is for canoeing, kayaking, or fishing. The lake is not approved by the Health Department for swimming. A lifeguard must be present, and lifejackets worn while a camper is in any boat.
- Shaving cream fights, water fights, etc. will not be tolerated. A group doing such in or near enough a building to cause damage, will face a charge of at least \$100.
- No use of the Challenge Course or pool is allowed unless Pineywoods authorized, trained personnel are present.
- Shoes must be worn at all times (unless a camper is in the pool or on sand volleyball courts).
- No clothing which is revealing, suggestive, or advertises alcohol, tobacco products, etc. will be allowed.
- Swimsuits must be modest. Breasts, midriff, buttocks, and genitalia must be covered, or a colored t-shirt must be worn over the swimsuit while at the pool. Lifeguards have discretion and can eject anyone not properly clothed from pool area.
- PDA will not be tolerated (public or private).
- Campers are not allowed to enter dorms of campers of the opposite sex.
- Campers are not allowed to leave the campgrounds while attending camp (unless with Missions group).
- Campers must attend all scheduled sessions and activities throughout the week.
- Campers are not allowed to ride in or on any vehicle during the camp (unless en-route to mission project with Missions group).
- Campers are not allowed to share ANY medication belonging to them with any other camper – all medication (prescription and non-prescription) must be checked in with the camp medic upon arrival. Prescription medication must be in the prescribed container.
- No golf carts, four-wheelers, or ATVs of any kind are allowed on camp except those used by the camp staff or unless pre-approved by camp management.

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*Pineywoods carries an accident policy on registered guests. This policy is intended to supplement your own insurance, and will pay only to its limits. There is no deductible. Sickness and pre-existing conditions are not covered. This policy will pay only for accidents immediately reported to Pineywoods. This insurance does not cover members who leave the grounds during your stay. Unauthorized activities may not be covered. Claims must be reported on forms provided by Pineywoods.*

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### **PowerPlus Camps Cell Phone Policy**

We understand cell phones are an integral part of life, but with the goal of creating a camp environment which maximizes focus on the Lord & minimizes distractions, some basic guidelines are necessary.

**STUDENTS** are not allowed to possess cell phones at camp. "Possess" means carry on their person, keep in their luggage, or otherwise have access to without the supervision of a sponsor.

**SPONSORS** must not allow cell phones to distract others or themselves from the camp program. Phone usage must be limited to only absolutely necessary calls, messages, or internet activity while at camp. Adults may use phones for note taking, Bible reading, & appropriate image capturing while at camp.

Suggestions for adult sponsors:

- Discourage students from bringing phones altogether.
- If students **MUST** bring their phone, **YOU MUST** keep their phone secure.
- Only allow students to use their phone traveling to camp, home from camp, or under the strictest adult supervision for a very limited amount of time while at camp.\*

\*Please only allow students to use their phones during free time, within ten feet of you, and only for calling or messaging their parents. Students should not use phones for photo taking, video recording, internet activity, gaming, or communication with anyone other than their legal guardian.

## 2025 PowerPlus Preteen Camp

### Talent Show Guidelines *(subject to change)*



1. The Talent Show is intended to be an entertainment event. Fun and funny acts are great – they do not have to have a spiritual value. However, remember that everything we do at PowerPlus Preteen Camp should be pleasing to God. So please take care to make sure that all acts, music, costumes, etc. are appropriate.
2. Campers may audition for the Talent Show during their Free Time on Day 2 of camp **only**. They may not skip Mission Adventures, Bible Study or Crazy Games to audition.
3. At the audition, the participant must provide his/her music on a CD or a USB flash drive. If the music/content is online, the participant must provide the exact address for it.
4. **All acts should be limited to 2 ½ minutes or less.**
5. All acts should be rehearsed before coming to camp. Preparedness will be a big factor in the selection process.
6. If campers will be wearing costumes in their act, they must audition in costume.
7. Well thought out, **rehearsed** church group skits are encouraged.
8. Singers may sing a cappella, but it is far better if they bring an accompanist or an accompaniment CD with them. Those without accompanist may be offered the opportunity to sing in a PowerPlus Talent Show Singing Group.
9. Dance routines should be carefully scrutinized for appropriateness for the occasion, and costumes must be modest.
10. For safety reasons, we cannot permit acts that involve gymnastics or tumbling.
11. Sponsors may only participate in background roles or as accompanists to singers.
12. For all performers, the Talent Show Director reserves the right to edit the length of musical selections to allow for the maximum number of participants.
13. Our judges will take great care to protect the feelings of the campers who audition. They will affirm their courage and effort so that the audition itself is a fun and memorable event for everyone who auditions. However, please be aware that it is possible that not all acts will be accepted for the Talent Show.
